VOTE FROM HOME

How can I vote from home?

In order to request a ballot, you must be registered to vote.

REGISTER TO VOTE - Eligible residents can register to vote online or by mail.

Fill out an application online at register.votespa.com

Voter Registration Applications are also available to download at PhiladelphiaVotes.com/voters

Once you are registered to vote, you can request your ballot.

To apply for a mail-in ballot online visit
apps.PhiladelphiaVotes.com

If you are applying for a mail ballot online, you must provide a PA Driver's License or PennDot ID number.

In Pennsylvania, you now have two options for mail ballots:

Absentee ballot – If you plan to be out of the municipality on election day or if you have a disability or illness, you should request an absentee ballot, which still requires you to list a reason for your ballot.

Mail-in ballot – If you aren't an absentee voter, you may apply for a mail-in ballot. You may simply request this ballot.

Once you successfully submit your application, the Philadelphia County Board of Elections will mail you your ballot along with instructions.

Once you receive your ballot...

- Mark your ballot, following the instructions.
- Place your ballot in the secrecy envelope and then put the secrecy envelope into the official envelope.
- Be sure to sign the form, or your ballot may not count.
- Return your ballot to the Philadelphia County Board of Elections (1400 JFK Blvd. City Hall, Room 142) so it arrives on time.

The deadline to submit voted ballots is 8:00 PM on Election Day (Postmarks not honored).



What if I don't have a Pennsylvania License or I.D.?

Registered voters without a Pennsylvania Driver's License or I.D. should download and print an absentee or mail-in ballot application from apps.PhiladelphiaVotes.com, fill out the form, and mail it to the Philadelphia County Board of Elections.

Important Dates

MAY 18:
Deadline to Register to Vote

MAY 26:
Last day to apply for a mail-in or absentee ballot

JUNE 2:
ELECTION DAY and Last day for County Boards of Elections to receive voted mail-in and civilian absentee ballots.
